Class of 2007 Bachelor's Degree Recipients Alumni Survey Summary

Background

In spring 2008, the Office of Institutional Research conducted a one-year follow-up survey of the 1,914 alumni who received a Bachelors' degree in fiscal year 2007.¹ The purpose of this survey was to assess graduate perceptions of their UMBC experience and gather feedback on post-UMBC activities.

Survey Methodology and Administration

The Office of Institutional Research developed a paper survey based on questions mandated by the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC). Alumni Relations and the Alumni database provided addresses for the mailing of the surveys. Of the 1,914 alumni, 1,897 had viable addresses and were eligible for the survey.² A lottery for graduates who completed the survey by the deadline was implemented in conjunction with three mailings as a strategy to increase participation.³ This strategy yielded a response rate of 24% (1,807 eligible, 435 completers).

Characteristics of Respondents

For comparisons by program area, those graduating in Interdisciplinary Studies are listed but not included because of their small number ($n < 7$).

- Females were over-represented, constituting 52% of degree recipients and 61% of respondents. (Table 1)
- Race/Ethnicity distributions for respondents were similar to all degree recipients, although Asians and African-Americans were slightly under-represented, while Whites were over-represented. (Table 1a)
- Respondents who matriculated as new freshmen were more likely to respond than those who matriculated as transfer students. (Table 1b)
- Those in the Math and Sciences were slightly under-represented, while those in the Social Science disciplines were slightly over-represented. However, this effect by discipline is most likely attributable to gender differences in enrollment and the gendered response rate. (Table 1c)

Residency

- Eighty-nine percent reported being a legal resident of Maryland at the time of enrollment and 83% reported currently living in Maryland. There is a 7-point shift in the number of respondents reporting living in the state of Maryland at the time of enrollment compared to the number reporting living out-of-state after graduation. However, of the 49 respondents who were not Maryland residents at matriculation, 27 (45%) remained in state after graduation. (Table 2)

² Of the 1,914 alumni, 90 surveys were undeliverable and 17 had foreign addresses. The foreign addresses were omitted from the study; there was no way to account for return postage from international addresses resulting in an under-representation of International students.

³ As a strategy to increase participation and an incentive to complete the survey, a lottery for four \$100 Amazon gift certificates were offered to students who completed the survey.

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Graduate School

- After completing a program at UMBC, 210 of the respondents enrolled in school again (48%). Of these 70% were female. (Table 2a & 2b)
- Overall, Social Science alumni were most likely to re-enroll. (Table 2b1)
- Of those respondents who re-enrolled, 89% were pursuing a graduate degree or higher. This translates to an overall 43% of respondents pursuing graduate level education or higher. (Table 2c)
- Females were more likely than males to pursue a Master's degree (63% and 56%, respectively). (Table 2d)
- Overall 82% reported majoring in the same or related field when they re-enrolled. Engineering, Computer and Information Science alumni had the highest re-enrollment in the same or related major (90%). (Table 2e)
- Eighty-two percent indicated UMBC preparation for graduate or professional study to be "excellent" or "good". (Table 2f)
- Seventy-four percent of respondents reported that if they were able to do it over again, they would definitely or probably major in the same field. Of those, Social Science alumni were most likely to say they would major in the same field. (Table 2g)

Graduate School/ Employment

- Eighty-one percent of alumni reported full or part-time employment within one year of graduation. Of those, sixty-five percent were full-time. (Table 3)
- Thirty-six percent of Social Science and 21% of Engineering Computer and Information Science alumni reported working full/part-time. (Table 3a)
- Of the 246 (57%) respondents who indicated that they did not re-enroll in school again, 223 (91%) reported working full or part-time. Twenty-three (9%) of the 246 respondents reported not being employed, and of those, 1% indicated not seeking employment. (Table 3b)
- Seventy-eight percent of respondents working (full or part-time) reported working in Maryland. (Table 3c)
- Of those re-enrolling at the graduate level or higher, 73% were employed full or part-time in Maryland. (Table 3c1)

Employment

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- Of all respondents reporting working full or part-time, 16% described their current occupation to be Information Systems professionals. (Table 3d)
- Seventy-six percent of all respondents reported their current occupation to be “directly” or “somewhat” related to their major (44% and, 32% respectively). Thirty percent of Social Science and 23% of Engineering, Computer and Information Science alumni reported the highest percentages of having a job “directly” or “somewhat” related to their major.
(Table 3e & 3f)
- Engineering, Computer and Information Science alumni were more likely to earn \$50,000 or more, with males more likely than females to report earning salaries at this level. (Table 3g & 3h)
- Sixty-seven percent of employed respondents reported UMBC gave them “excellent” or “good” preparation for their current job. Overall, Social Science alumni reported the highest satisfaction with their preparation. (Table 3i)
- Seventy-nine percent of respondents stated that if they had it to do over again, they would attend UMBC. (Table 3j)
